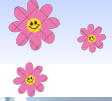

WHY TEENAGER DRIVES YOU CRAZY (AND IT'S NOT YOUR FAULT)

From the Counsellor's Desk: Ms. Punam Valecha



Does your teenager drive you crazy sometimes? One day they act like adults, making smart choices. The next day, they do something so foolish that you wonder what happened to their brain. If this sounds familiar, you're not alone. Every parent of a teenager goes through this. Here's something that might surprise you: your teenager's brain is not fully grown yet, it keeps growing until about age 25. The part that helps with thinking ahead, controlling impulses, and making good decisions is the last part to finish growing.

Think of it like this—your teen is driving a car (their body) but the steering wheel and brakes (their brain) are still being built. This is why they sometimes make choices that seem crazy to you. When you tell your teenager something important and they seem to ignore you, they're not trying to be rude on purpose. Their brain just works differently than yours. They feel emotions much stronger than they can think logically. So even when you explain the "why" behind a rule, their feelings often win over their thinking.

Being a teenager is tough work. They're no longer little kids, but they're not adults either. During these years, they're trying to answer big questions like "Who am I?" and "Where do I fit in?" This is hard work that takes time.

When your teen argues with you or doesn't want to follow your advice, they're not just being difficult. They're practising how to become their own person. It's like learning to ride a bike—they need to wobble a bit before they can balance on their own. You might think your teen needs you to solve all their problems. But here's the truth—they don't. What they need most is for you to understand what they're going through and believe in them.

If you always jump in to fix things or make decisions for them, they start to think "I can't handle anything myself." This makes them feel less confident, not more. Instead, try to: Listen to them without immediately giving solutions. Show them you understand it's hard being a teenager. Let them try to figure things out (even if they make mistakes). Be patient when they seem emotional or unreasonable. There's always a reason behind your teenager's behaviour. Maybe they're stressed about school, worried about friends, or dealing with changes in their body. Most of the time, you won't understand the reason—and that's okay. Often, they don't fully understand it themselves.

When your teenager comes to you upset, angry, or confused, they're not looking for you to fix everything. They just want to let out their feelings. They want to cry, complain, or vent without being judged or lectured. They need you to be their safe place. Think of yourself as their emotional cushion. Sometimes they just need to fall into your arms and let it all out. That's the best gift you can give them, and honestly, it's what they want most from you.

Honestly—being a parent today is harder than ever. Between jobs, bills, and daily responsibilities, it's tough to always be patient and understanding. Don't blame yourself for this. You're doing your best in challenging times.

Think about it this way—you wouldn't expect a 5-year-old to drive a car or do algebra. In the same way, you can't expect a teenager's brain to work exactly like an adult's brain.
